REVELATION 3:7-13

In a powerfully emotive sermon, David shared with us how even a Biblical passage such as Revelation can be relevant for us all today. After all, we don't have to be super spiritual with endless biblical knowledge to read the Bible.

During times that are hard, we can turn to the words of Revelation 3: holy and true. We are called to be holy and true, just like Jesus is - and His word, in the Bible, is the only truly holy thing in this world. When we live in a world that operates on lies and deception, holding onto God's truth can sometimes be the only thing we can cling to.

This passage tells us that Jesus knows we have little strength. Living is hard. God understands our struggles and knows that life is tough. We have little strength. Living in these hard times, it's easy for our moral compass to get distorted by other things, and not biblical truth.

But endurance creates character. Jesus endured the cross. If God had just 'fixed' it for Jesus, then the problem of sin wouldn't have been fixed for us.

In verse 11, Jesus tells us He is coming soon, and to hold on. Every day brings us closer to Jesus coming back.



01 — Little strength

Jesus and John, the author of Revelation, grew up during the Roman occupation, when the Jewish nation had 'little strength'. What do you think the readers of this letter would have felt, reading this passage?



02 — Endurance

Jesus encourages us to 'hold on' during this passage, and David spoke powerfully on endurance. Which Biblical characters make you think of endurance? What lessons can we learn from them?



04 — Practising what (David) preaches

Are you ready if Jesus comes back right now?
