DISCIPLESHIP PART 2

Jesus' last words were to go out and make disciples - all of us, not just church leaders. A study found that people who started coming to church did so 86% of the time because a friend asked them, and only 2% because a church leader did. Our discipleship means going out into the community, not waiting for people to come to us. It means going toward people just like God did by sending Jesus, His son.

In reality we can't speak to everyone and it can feel daunting, especially if we're not naturally evangelists. We can't do it on our own: we need God and each other. The Great Commission is made to be shared - we can't change the world all in one go. But we can change the places that we live. The encouragement, and the challenge, is to follow Jesus as a disciple, making other disciples, not just being a church-going person.
