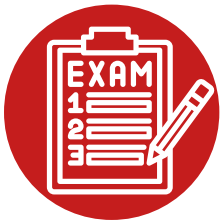
Jesus empowered us to make disciples, and if you think you're not 'worthy' to be a disciplemaker - you're not alone! The Bible is full of people just like us, making the worst kinds of mistakes. Even David, the great king, was a murderer and adulterer. His prayer, Psalm 51, shows that God can use anyone. God works on the inside while the world looks at the outside - and that's only possible because of the Spirit.

As God influences us, we can influence others, passing on the joy of the Spirit. We can't be disciple makers without the Holy Spirit: Jesus spent 3 years with his disciples, but it was only when they were sent the Spirit that they were ready to make disciples of their own. In Exodus, the Spirit not only inspires creativity, but empowers people to teach. In Ezekiel, a vision of the Spirit pouring out, getting deeper the farther away it was from the temple, should be our guide: bringing the Spirit to the world and seeing it changed.
